Make it known, make it better

This is the NDIS awareness campaign on raising a concern or a complaint.

NDIS participants have the right to be safe and to receive quality services from the providers and workers they choose to support them under the NDIS. Raising a concern or complaint is important.

The NDIS have now developed a series of videos and posters to empower people with a disability, or their support networks, to raise a concern or complaint if they are not happy with the quality or safety of the NDIS supports or services.

When a concern or complaint is raised it helps NDIS providers, and workers understand what is important to people with a disability, improves the quality of services and helps make the NDIS be better for everyone.

If a complaint raises serious compliance issues the NDIS Commission, it has the power to take action. You may seek support from family, a friend, or an independent advocate In raising your concern or complaint.

We have put posters around at our Notting Hill and Hallam sites to help inform, educate, and remind participants on their rights as a NDIS participant.

HAVE YOU HAD A NDIS PLAN REASSESSMENT RECENTLY?

What is a NDIS plan reassessment?



Every NDIS plan includes a 'reassessment date'. We need to look at the plan with you by this date and decide if any changes are needed. If a plan reaches its reassessment date before the reassessment is completed, the current plan will be varied to extend it by 12 months so you can continue accessing supports.

Please remember to inform the Waverley Social Enterprises NDIS team or your HR Support Officer of your new plan, including the new start date once your reassessment or review has happened.

A new service agreement will then be given out to you for signing.

Informing Waverley Social Enterprises when you have a new plan, or any changes are made to an existing plan, is an important part of your employment with Waverley Social Enterprises.




We said Goodbye to Assembly Production Manager Li Zhang on March 16th.


Our ongoing partnership sees Waverley Catering consistently being booked to deliver to Icon Head Office & their major projects across Melbourne.




